Life and Death in Bandon Workhouse During the Great Famine Gerard Moran, Historian & Senior Researcher, Social Science UCG

Historian Gerard Moran explores life inside Bandon Workhouse during the Great Famine. Drawing on historical records, he examines the challenges faced by inmates, the impact of overcrowding, and the role of emigration in relieving pressure on the poor law system. A compelling local perspective on one of Ireland's most devastating periods.

Unlocking a Social History of Bandon from Early 20th Century Census Records

Census returns record more than population statistics. They have obvious uses for genealogy but also as a means of exploring how people lived in the past, the kind of occupations that they had, and the location of many centres that made up civic life such as schools, post offices, police stations and general businesses. A staff member from the Local Studies Library will discuss the 1901, 1911 and 1926 census records and how they provide a fascinating insight into aspects of the social history of Bandon in the early decades of the 20th century.

A Guided Historical Walk:
Tracing the Path of Bandon's Town Walls with Dan Holland.

Join this guided walk around Boyle's Bandon as we trace the route of the town's historic walls. While only a few fragments of the original fortifications remain today, the walk will follow the line where the wall once stood, helping participants imagine the boundaries that once enclosed the early town.

Along the route, Dan will explore the history of Bandon's Walled Town, explain why the walls were built, how the town developed within them and the role they played in everyday life. The walk will also touch on the people, places and events connected with the streets and spaces along the former line of the walls.

A chance to rediscover Bandon's past by walking the paths where its' historic defences once stood.

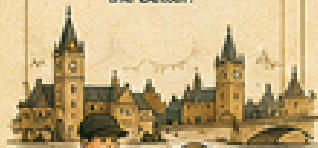

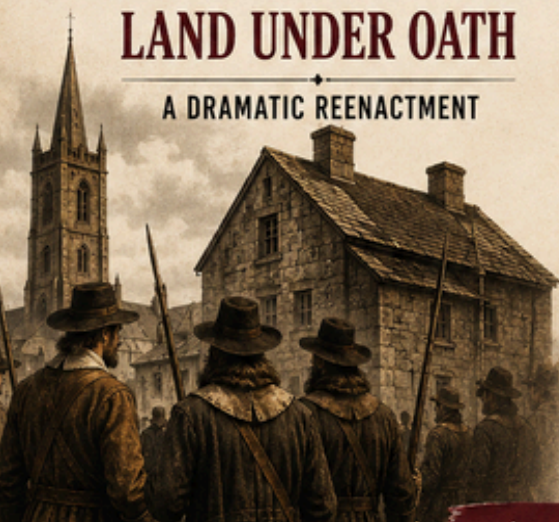
